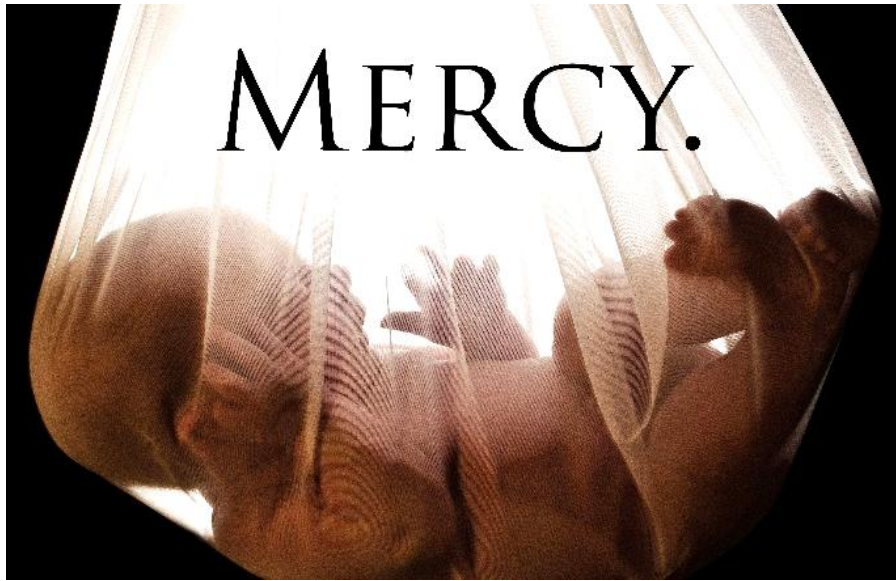


On December 17, 2025, Pa. Rep. Kathleen Tomlinson voted for a Bill to create a "right to abortion" until birth in the Pennsylvania Constitution

Rep. Tomlinson represents the 18th Pa. House District in Bucks County, which includes Bensalem Township and Hulmeville Borough. Rep. Tomlinson was first elected in March 2020. Until this vote, she had compiled a mixed record on the "abortion issue." Her immediate predecessor, Rep. Gene DiGirolamo, and her dad, Pa. Sen. Tommy Tomlinson, both compiled consistently pro-life voting records.



Some Facts About Children in the Womb

Conception creates a new and unique human being whose sex and physical characteristics are determined.

At 21 days after conception, the child's heart starts beating.

At ten weeks, the child's arms, legs, fingers, toes, and internal organs are formed, and he or she is capable of feeling pain.

At 24 weeks, many babies become viable, which means the ability to live outside the womb with assistance.

The Importance of Responding to Rep. Tomlinson's Vote

Very little possibility exists that this Amendment will pass in the current 27-23 Republican to Democrat Majority in the Pa. Senate. However, if the Democrats ever took control of the Pa. Senate by gaining two seats, then this Amendment would likely pass the Senate, as all Democrats would very likely support it.

The Current Status of Abortion in Pennsylvania

Abortion is legal in Pa. up to 24-weeks gestation and until birth under exceptions for preventing "the death of the mother" or "loss of major bodily function." According to the Pa. Department of Health (DOH), there were 32,946 abortions committed in Pa. in 2024.

How are Abortions Committed in Pennsylvania?

According to the most recent Pa. DOH report, approximately 40% of children in the womb were killed by "suction curettage" or "sharp curettage" by which the child is dismembered by a powerful vacuum suction device or a sharp knife.

Approximately 5% were killed by "dilation and evacuation" by which the child is dismembered and removed by "medical pliers."

Approximately 55% were committed by chemicals. The first, mifepristone, starves the child to death by blocking the needed nutrient, progesterone, so the child detaches from his or her mother's uterine wall. The second chemical, misoprostol, causes harsh contractions of the mother's uterus to deliver (usually into a toilet) the now dead child. The Likely Impact of Creating a "Right to Abortion" in the Pennsylvania Constitution

Pa. currently has laws that restrict Medicaid funding of abortions and require informed consent and parental consent for minors. This "right to abortion" amendment would eliminate these laws and annually increase abortions in Pa. by at least 10,000.



Do Not Be Fooled by the Fake Amendment

In an attempt to mitigate the charge that this Bill would legalize abortion until birth, Rep. Tomlinson and her pro-abortion Democrat allies passed an amendment to this Bill, which allegedly allows Pa. to still ban "post-viability" abortions. However, this amendment would still legalize such abortions if expectant mothers claim a totally subjective "mental distress" exception.
